Consumer Information on Orthodontic Insurance

Orthodontic Insurance is not available to the individual, but it often is available to an employee group as part of the dental insurance benefit package.

Your employer may offer orthodontic coverage for eligible employees. You may need to work a minimum number of hours per week, or there may be a 6 to 12 month waiting period. Eligibility may change plans or delete orthodontic coverage while you are in the middle of treatment. If you terminate your job, your benefits stop.

Every Insurance plan offers a different level of benefits. The orthodontic benefit is always different from the dental plan.

The payment schedule arranged between you and the orthodontist's book-keeper may be different from the schedule imposed by the insurance company.

As a courtesy to our patients, we will file your insurance. If your insurance is terminated during treatment, you will be responsible for the outstanding balance. This balance will be paid monthly until complete.

If your insurance changes during treatment, please let the office know as soon as possible.
